

MAIN Class Definitions

Scholastic Novice:

Novice color guards are in the early stages of development and utilize introductory level qualities in design and performance. This class is based on training of basic skills and basic elements of design. Evaluation will be on the MAIN Novice Class Sheets.

Scholastic Regional AA:

Regional AA class color guards utilize introductory/beginning level qualities in design and performance. Color guards in this class exhibit training and design techniques that develop to a moderate level according to the WGI Regional A class criteria. Success in this class may indicate readiness for Scholastic Regional A. Evaluation will be on WGI Regional A Class Sheets.

Scholastic Regional A:

Regional A class color guards utilize introductory/beginning level qualities in design and performance. Color guards in this class exhibit training and design techniques that are frequently successful according to the WGI Regional A class criteria. Evaluation will be on WGI Regional A Class Sheets.

Scholastic Local A:

Local A class color guards utilize intermediate level qualities in design and performance. Color guards in this class would be competitive with the middle to bottom half of WGI's A class (whether or not they compete in WGI events). Color guards in this class exhibit training and design techniques that develop to a moderate level according to the WGI A class criteria. Evaluation will be on WGI A Class Sheets.

Scholastic National A:

National A class color guards utilize intermediate level qualities in design and performance. Color guards in this class would be competitive with the middle to top half of WGI's A class (whether or not they compete in WGI events). Color guards in this class exhibit training and design techniques that are frequently successful according to the WGI A class criteria. Evaluation will be on WGI A Class Sheets.

Independent Junior:

Junior color guards are in the early stages of development and utilize introductory level qualities in design and performance. This class is based on training of basic skills and basic elements of design. Evaluation will be on the MAIN Novice Class Sheets.

Independent Novice:

Novice color guards are in the early stages of development and utilize introductory level qualities in design and performance. This class is based on training of basic skills and basic elements of design. Evaluation will be on the MAIN Novice Class Sheets.

Independent Regional A:

Regional A class color guards utilize introductory/beginning level qualities in design and performance. Evaluation will be on WGI Regional A Class Sheets.

Independent A:

A class color guards utilize intermediate level qualities in design and performance. Evaluation will be on WGI A Class Sheets.

Scholastic and Independent Open & World:

Each class will be defined according to the WGI standards as outlined in the WGI Rule book and will be judged accordingly.
